[The American Historical Association was formed at Saratoga, Sept. 9, 1884. The "Papers" of the association, consisting of reports of the proceedings of the annual meetings and some of the historical monographs that had been read, were published by Putnam, 1885-91, and have been collected in 5 substantial volumes, the copyright being held by the association. These volumes, giving the proceedings and papers of the first 7 annual meetings, are not public documents, but because of their historic interest and also on account of the fact that they were the forerunners of the annual reports of the association, a class for them has been assigned in this Checklist; see SI 4.5:

By act of Congress approved Jan. 4, 1889, the association was incorporated, the act providing, that "said association shall report annually to the secretary of the Smithsonian Institution concerning its proceedings and the condition of historical study in America; said secretary shall communicate to Congress the whole of such reports or such portions thereof as he shall see fit." From that time the proceedings and historical monographs of the association have been issued by the Government in 1 or 2 volumes yearly, under the title, Annual reports of American Historical Association (SI 4.1:). The first 2 issues in this form, those for 1889 and 1890, duplicate the proceedings of the 6th and 7th meetings, already published in the Papers, and also partially duplicate the monographs in v. 4 and 5 of the Papers. The issue of the Papers was discontinued after the 7th meeting.]
