[Until 1853, the erection of custom-houses and other public buildings was under the direction of the Secretary of the Treasury who employed architects and superintendents as necessary. In 1853, with a view to more efficient management, a practical engineer from the War Department was detailed to take charge
  of the work subject to the Secretary of the Treasury, general regulations were adopted, and a department
  of construction organized.
