**N6. HYDROGRAPHIC OFFICE**

[The present Hydrographic Office was established in 1866, but the hydrographical as well as the astronomical work of the Navy Department had begun in the Depot of Charts and Instruments which was established at Washington in 1830 (*see also* historical note under N14.). When the Bureau of Ordnance and Hydrography, now Ordnance Bureau (N18.), was organized under act of Aug. 31, 1842, the Secretary of the Navy, by an order dated Nov. 26, 1842, directed that the Depot of Charts and Instruments be attached to that bureau as its hydrographic branch. Under another act of reorganization approved July 5, 1862, the Depot, by that time known as the United States Naval Observatory and Hydrographical Office, was detached from the Bureau of Ordnance and transferred to the newly organized Bureau of Navigation (N17.).]

The astronomical and hydrographical branches of the work were separated in 1866 when the present Hydrographic Office had its beginning in an act of June 21, 1866 (Stat. L. v. 14, p. 69). This act established "A Hydrographic Office attached to the Bureau of Navigation in the Navy Department, for the improvement of the means for navigating safely the vessels of the Navy and of the mercantile marine, by providing, under the authority of the Secretary of the Navy, accurate and cheap nautical charts, sailing directions, navigators, and manuals of instructions for the use of all vessels of the United States and for the benefit and use of navigators generally."

† Issue for 1910 is 12°. Since the abolishment of the Bureau of Equipment, July 1, 1910, the Coal notice for foreign ports has been issued by the Bureau of Supplies and Accounts; *see* footnote class N20.11.
