P. POST-OFFICE DEPARTMENT

[The Post-Office was temporarily established by law under the Constitution, Sept. 22, 1789, and was continued by acts of Aug. 4, 1790 and Mar. 3, 1791.

The acts approved Feb. 20, 1792, May 8, 1794, Mar. 2, 1799, Apr. 30, 1810, and Mar. 3, 1825, established a General Post-Office, provided for the appointment of a Postmaster-General and other officers, set forth their duties, etc.

Although called Post-Office Department from a very early date, it was not until 1872 that it was established as an Executive Department by act approved June 8, 1872 (Stat. L. v. 17, p. 283).
