Proclamations are accurately and promptly printed on foolscap paper, for limited distribution on demand, immediately upon receipt by the Bureau of Rolls and Library, State Dept., and are reprinted in the Session laws (S7.6:) and in the Statutes at large (S7.9:).

Special messages appear as separate documents in Congressional set, and sometimes in

bureau edition also.

Veto messages appear as separate documents in Congressional set. A compilation of veto messages, Apr. 5, 1792–Aug. 4, 1886, was prepared by Ben: Perley Poore under direction of Senate Committee on Printing.
